



It is a pleasure to report that activities in our key focus areas have been meaningful.

Placement and utilization of trained resources has been per our commitment. Preventive care and outreach has been good.

Adequate equipment supplies have been inventories, a helpdesk for calls and preventive maintenance visits have resulted in a bare 2% of equipment outage.

An outreach plan is in place and Ekam field officers have sought proactive feedback on the performance and concerns around the Dantewada program.

HIGHLIGHTS:

• 18 Sick Neonatal Care Unitswere functional in 17 districts.

• Total 186 cold calls were made to staff nurses through help line number.

• 1 breakdown call was received.

• 34 preventive visits were made by engineers in SNCUs.

27 microbial surveillance samples were collected from different SNCUs out of which 20 were found positive.
Mentor nurses have received 2nd spell of training.

 Total 26 preventive visits have been done at DH, CHC and PHC in Dantewada.

• 98 Nurses who are placed at CHC and PHC have been trained by Mentor Nurses in Dantewada.

STAFF STATUS:

• Under the PCA(Program Cooperation Agreement), 18 SNCUs were functional across 17 districts (Raipur, Durg, Dhamtari, Bilaspur, Bijapur, Rajnandgaon, Ambikapur, Jagdalpur, Koriya, Korba, Raigarh, Kanker, Dantewada, Jashpur, Mahasamund and Kawardha, Balod and JanjgirChampa) providing 24/7 care delivery to the infants in May 18. All functional SNCUs have adequate number of trained staff nurses and Data entry operators (DEO).

• A total of 215 staff nurses, 16 Doctors and 19 DEOs were placed across these 18 SNCUs.

EQUIPMENT STATUS:


• In all, 920 equipment supplies were inventoried within the 18 SNCUs.

• 553 (60%) equipment supplies were covered under the Annual Maintenance Contract or were still under warranty while around 40 % of the equipment (367) was not under warranty.


• On an average, 98 % of the equipment was functioning. While only 2% of both, the non warranty and warranty equipment was not functional.

• In order to ensure timely repairs, all the SNCUs were provided with the central helpline phone number. During this month 34 preventive visits have been made by engineers in SNCUs and First Referral Units.

•Only one breakdown call was registered from Dhamtari in May 2018.

DANTEWADA PROJECT:

• Total 26 preventive visits have been made at District Hospitals, Community Health Centers (CHC) and Public Health Centers (PHC) in Dantewada.

- Mentor Nurses have visited 11 PHCs and 3 CHCs for field training.
- 98 Nurses received the training.

FIELD VISITS:

• Ekam field officers visited Dhamtari district hospital; Kanker district hospital, Kondagaon district hospital, Dantewada district hospital and Potali PHC at Dantewada to get the feedback about Dantewada programmed and solve leave related issues of Dantewada staff.

• Field visits were also conducted to check the documents and monitor the functioning of SNCUs and PHCs in Dantewada by meeting the concerned staff at the hospitals.
