The year 2010-11 was a remarkable year for us in terms of sheer scale and scope of operations we have expanded to most of the districts of Tamil Nadu almost . Our belief in public private partnership, our belief in unconditional and boundary less support regardless of financial consideration has saved more than 800 children and treated as many as 984 children and screened around 14000 children in this year alone. Majority of the patients were from the ICH and KKT insurance programme. With this since its inception has treated 1200 children. These were possible only because of the collaboration and support of so many people and institution.





EKAM— ICH partnership saves children

The core value of EKAM is to support the government hospitals than substituting it. It has continued to work in ICH Chennai and expanded its support to Chengelpat and Madurai GHs, with the help of dedicated doctors in these hospitals. In the year 2009-10 we have treated/supported treatment of 287 children, however there were high mortality as well as many as 83 children died, this shows the urgency and significance of the work we have to undertake in the government hospitals. With this experience we have increased our support to ICH with the help of various organizations EKAM provided medicine, lab test, renting ventilators etc to more than 800 children, however there was a mortality of 126.

Some of the key initiatives in ICH

- 1. 3 ventilators was donated by rotary club of Adyar to ICH, worth 2.5 lakhs each

- Renting ventilators support started in Chengalpet NICU and Mdr, ICH. Neonatal Ventilator donated by Fr234 nurses appointed by EKAM Nurses recruitment.

234 Nurses appointed in SNCUS

One of the main reasons for high mortality in the pediatric wing is inadequate staff, sensing this urgency of the TN govt requested EKAM to take up the an assignment to recruit 234 nurses in 41 SNCUs(Sick New Born care Units) . The salaries were paid by NRHM and EKAM managed the entire staffing process for one year. EKAM recruited nurses and managed their payroll till May 2011.



Study of GHs in Tamil Nadu

NRHM sanctioned 4.8 lakhs for the Facility based newborn care with Community linkages project at Kancheepuram. Ekam was given the role of monitoring and implementation of NICU projects all over Tamil-Nadu, the entire funding was provided by NRHM. EKAM visited 23 SNCUs in Tamil nadu and prepared a report

Paripoorna bala suraksha is a health assurance scheme to vulnerable children was started last year, 2600 children were identified through Disha foundation volunteers, out of which 968 children were screened through medical camps .The children were given ID cards and a fund of 7 lakhs was raised for this scheme from the donors.

Training programme:

12 wks training on neonatal and Pediatric care for the anganwadi workers, NGO caretakers and SHG members coordinated by Ms.Stella got successfully concluded. ICDS deputy director and DPO were invited as chief guests.

Training done by IMNCI- (Integrated management of Neonatal and Childhood illnesses) for 75 nurses till now as 3 batches.

New initiatives:

Qualitative assessment of Maternal and Child Health Care in medical college and District Hospitals, UNICEF has sanctioned 1.53 lakhs for the project on identifying the bottlenecks in Quality maternal and child care in 4 government hospitals in Krishnagiri, Salem, Metur and Hosur. There was more need for the man power support of Pediatricians, security and house keeping staff, repairing of equipment, lab support and drugs. SIX for a Cause. HINDU -VGN INITIATIVE TO HELP EKAM



A cheque for Rs. 4,95,944 lakh, collected through the "6 for a Cause" initiative of The Hindu in collaboration with VGN Developers, was handed over to the Ekam Foundation here on Thursday.

The Foundation is a charitable trust providing healthcare for the underprivileged children.

Seeing the World Cup and the excitement around it as having the potential of supporting a social cause, the campaign was based on an arrangement that for every "six" that an Indian batsman had hit during the league matches of the World Cup, VGN Developers would donate Rs. 10,000 to the Ekam Foundation. The Hindu had invited contributions from its readers as well.

With 26 sixes bringing in Rs.2.6 lakh for the cause, VGN decided to add to its contribution, raising the amount to Rs. 4 lakh. The Hindu readers also made a contribution of over Rs. 90,000.

Founder Trustee of Ekam Foundation Meera Menon, who received the cheque from N. Ram, Editor-in-Chief of The Hindu, said the sum would be used to support two children from Vellore and Chengalpattu now undergoing treatment at the Kanchi Kamakoti CHILDS Trust Hospital. A portion of the sum would go towards purchasing drugs and conducting lab tests for children at The Institute of Child Health and Hospital for Children (ICH), Chennai.

"In Chennai, we work with the ICH and we want to expand our work to cover more government hospitals in other districts," said Ms. Menon. The Foundation has tied up with 18 private hospitals in the city.

Managing Director of VGN Developers Pratish Devadoss said this was one way of giving back to society. "It is a corporate social responsibility initiative. It gives us tremendous joy to be able to contribute in some way. We would like to be part of initiatives that support causes such as education, nutrition and health care and shelter. It is our responsibility."

Terming the initiative "a good start," Mr. Ram said the Ekam Foundation was doing excellent work in providing free medical care to the unprivileged children. "The title sponsor over-fulfilled its commitment and contributed more than
