As we approach 2018/19, it is evident that the stepping stones laid down in the year gone past are part of the incredible journey the Ekam team is embarking on.



Major initiatives

1. Save a Child Program

No child should be denied the right to health care, under any circumstance - this is the key mantra of Ekam. The thin line between life and death is one which is very often dictated by the availability of resources. Dealing with life-threatening illnesses and medical situations in children is a harrowing and daunting experience for any parent. Out-of-pocket expenditure and the inability to pay for treatment add to their existing woes, thereby adding to their distress.

The 'Save a Child' program works to reach out to and provide medical support to any child who needs us!! Our team works round the clock to ensure that every child who is referred to us is treated in a caring & respectful environment. We begin by identifying children needing support, facilitating

their treatment [Including any expenses] till their discharge, counselling the parents/guardians and following up with the families post discharge to ensure they comply with the doctor's advice.

While always ensuring that the right thing is done for the child; leveraging existing resources within the public health facilities is Ekam's priority at all times. Effective utilisation of insurance schemes and services provided by the government is one of our key focus areas. In 2017-18, we supported 677 children through the 'Save a Child' project, moving us one step closer to our vision.



2. BALA AROGYA SURAKSHA

The Bala Arogya Suraksha or the BAS project is aimed at building a model to strengthen the quality of maternal and child health care by encouraging local governance and social accountability. Simply put, the Bala Arogya Suraksha is a program which focuses on preventive approaches to challenging situations which affect the health of the child and the mother. Working parallelly on overarching areas within the Public Health facilities as well the community is our modus operandi to address any identified areas of concern. The main focus is on improving community well being, happiness and health.

A. HEALTH FACILITY UPGRADATION

Ekam works with the Public Health system to augment care delivery to needy children. By doing what we can to support any requirement in government hospitals, the impact, scale is much more and sustainability is ensured. Our aim is to complement the government and not replace it. We do this by

- Supporting the recruitment of staffs like nurses, doctors, data entry operators etc
- Providing trainings to nurses and doctors
- Building mentor trainers as part of a Training of trainers model
- Conducting microbial surveillance to counter infection related deaths
- Repairing and maintaining of equipment in newborn ICUS
- Setting up Help desks in outpatient rooms to manage crowds and provide counselling to patients

HUMBLED TO KNOW WE ARE HEADING IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION – TEAM CHHATTISGARH STANDS TALL!

Ekam in Chhattisgarh is a key milestone in our 'Oneness' journey. The Chhattisgarh story celebrates the success of a tripartite collaboration - the Government of Chhattisgarh, National Health Mission, UNICEF and Ekam. The project was for a period of 1 year starting from Oct 2014- Dec 15 with an initial target of 13 SNCUs. The partnership was a huge success resulting in operation of 13 SNCUs. The agreement was extended for two more years and today, post evaluation, the project has been scaled up and EKAM supports 18 of the State's SNCUs that run to full capacity.

The once high NMR and IMR rates have reduced drastically – although the war is

not over yet and there is much to be done. This has been achieved through a holistic approach to improved quality of care in SNCUs, support in recruitment of nurses, training of SNCU staff, upkeep of equipment and an aggressive combat against infections via microbial surveillance. Leveraging technology, 24/7 monitoring of equipment upkeep has been possible using online software for Equipment maintenance which captures the data of break down call, preventive maintenance of engineers & downtime. To deal with high rate of infections, Ekam tied up with the Dept of Microbiology AlIMS Raipur.

Ekam has several breakthroughs to its credit

- The setting up of Skill labs and MCH (Maternal and Child Health) training Centres
- Equipment maintenance of non warranted equipments, end user training and SOPs regarding usage of equipments to doctors and nurses
- Supporting MCTS (Mother and Child Tracking System) in tracking every mother and newborn post discharge and follow up in the community
- Implementation of RBSK (Rashtriya Bala Swasthya Karyakram) programme in setting up DEICs (District Early Intervention Centres) and identifying referrals
- Implementation of RKSK (Rashtriya Kishori Swasthya Karyakram) and reaching the youth of the community
- Facilitating Child and Maternal death reviews and prenatal audits.

A much lauded intervention is the implementation of Mentor Nurses and Supportive Supervision programs at all levels (Building Certified nurse Mentors across the State). The team is also exploring a model to create mentors from Community based institutions and Youth. They will identify the gaps in the facility and community and be a bridge between facility and community.

B. ONE WITH THE COMMUNITY

Promoting the well being of the community is of paramount importance to ensure sustained health, both of the mother and the child. This year, we focused on areas which improve the gross community happiness. As health is closely related to other socio-economic and developmental indictors, our approaches in the last year have broadened to focus on areas of nutrition, food, sanitation, livelihood and education.

I. EARLY REFERRAL AND IDENTIFICATION OF ILLNESSES

While we continue to promote early referrals by conducting screening camps, we have also tied up with the DEIC [District Early Intervention Centres] of the Central Government's RBSK scheme, thereby ensuring timely treatment.

KARNATAKA

In Karnataka, we partnered with Sharada Eye Hospital to screen patients and conduct eye surgeries for needy patients. 300 surgeries for adults were conducted by supporting the community with what they really require, we have ensured that we have built and cemented a long lasting sustaining partnership, one which will help us work with them towards improving their health and happiness.

III. DEMOCRATISING THE GOVERNANCE PROCESS

Encouraging the community to take the first step towards local health governance is a long process, which includes continuous dialogue, participation and mobilisation activities. The emphasis is on promoting self- introspection and work on themselves, in order for them to be able to want to do more for and contribute to their brethren.



3. INSPIRING RESEARCH IN ACTION

Our interventions and learning on the field transform every day with the way we understand, treat and prevent the causes of child and maternal illnesses. The Prajna Knowledge Research and Teaching Institute is a consortium of trainers and experts in medicine, public health, research and social sector. Together, we work to provide evidence based solutions to the problems we identify on the field. Regular social audits and interactions are planned to understand the impact and effectiveness of our programs on the community. Any gaps identified will be regularly communicated to the team, our strategies tweaked immediately and our interventions reframed to suit program effectiveness, thereby ensuring maximum impact.

TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

We have a technical advisory committee to advise Ekam Team on technical aspects. The committee members in Chennai, India, meet once a month and the Ekam team presents their projects and seeks inputs from the advisers. For members outside of Chennai, we share the presentations/proposals by mail and meet on Skype as and when needed. On a monthly basis we (Project Staff) meet Dr Saradha Suresh (Senior Paediatrician, former Director of ICH & HC, Chennai), Dr Seetha (Senior Paediatrician, Former Professor in ICH & HC, Chennai), Dr. Arasar (Paediatrician, Director of ICH & HC, Chennai), Dr Padmapriya (Neonatologist, SIMS Hospital, Chennai), Dr. Srinivasan (Registrar- ICH & HC, Chennai) for discussions on Project Proposals, Report Templates and Project Documentation. They guide us on road maps and project pathways based on their good will and rich professional experience in the field of Child health.



4. EKAM USA Chapter

The EKAM USA chapter has been one of the key stakeholders in promoting our work outside India. Well-meaning friends and individuals in the USA have joined hands to support Ekam's work in the USA. Funds and resources are mobilised and contributions made to Ekam's programs in India. Currently, there are 12 chapters in the USA.

The US chapter also engages doctors and medical professionals from various specialties and offers collaborative training programs for health staff in India, offering them opportunities for mutual learning in the medical arena.

A project called the Ekam Youth Ambassador (EYA) Program was set up wherein young adults and children devote their time, energy and resources to our cause. Each youth chapter or group of youth is attached to one district in India and works towards the betterment of that particular district in collaboration with Ekam field staff. The 'Adopt your village' initiative also acts as a platform to sensitise well-off kids on the as-is situation back in India, offering them varied opportunities to connect with their roots. They also explore local service activities and coordinate as per their schedule and available opportunities.









BABY KATHIRAVAN

Tamil Nadu - Prompt Cardiac Care saves heartbreak for labourer couple

Karpoora sundarapandiyan and his wife were shattered when they heard the news which they could barely understand – their child had a serious heart problem. Kathiravan, their 6 month old son was diagnosed with Truncus Arteriosus, for which he was being treated at the Government Rajaji Hospital- Madurai.

A labourer from Ramanathapuram district working on daily wages, the father's first thoughts were about how to find the means to save his child. He could only understand that the problem was serious and many tests were required. Since he required further evaluation, the treating doctor had referred the child to Ekam for his further treatment.

Being an emergency, the child was immediately shifted to G.Kuppuswamy Naidu Memorial Hospital, Coimbatore and Dr. Vijayakumar –Consultant Paediatric CT Surgeon and his team decided on Intra Cardiac Repair with RV-PA Conduit. This was a critical procedure the parents could ill afford – but there was no choice but to go through with the surgery.

The family was helpless and unable to arrange treatment cost, so knowing their situation Dr. Vijayakumar approached Ekam to support with cost of the surgery. Ekam, thanks to its network of benevolent donors, was able to take on a major responsibility for Kathiravan's treatment.

Under skilled hands and supported by kind hearts, the child underwent surgery and was duly discharged, declared fit for a normal childhood. Ekam has continued to track his progress and is happy to report that he is a healthy young child now, bringing joy to his grateful parents.



BABY OF AMSA

Struggling preterm Baby of Amsa breathes easy now

Ms. Amsa from Ramapuram, Chennai, gave birth to female child at a private clinic. The distressed and breathless baby was categorized under Preterm/Respiratory Distress Syndrome, after which they were referred to a private hospital. The baby was put on Ventilator support in the ICU for 7 days.

Mr. Umapathi, the father of the child, takes care of his family by working as a Tailor. As the only earning member, he could not afford the treatment

cost and resorted to seeking support. He managed to arrange part of the expenses for treatment on his own and then approached Ekam for financial help. Ekam bridged the gap and contributed to the child's treatment.

On 9/10/2017 the baby was discharged from the hospital and now, we are pleased to share that she lives a healthy, happy life.





BABY DEVA VARSHINI

The Gift of Life for Baby Deva Varshini



Manikandan & Lakshmi reside in Thirukkalimedu village of Kancheepuram District. On 13/4/2017, Lakshmi gave birth to a female child named Deva Varshini at the Kancheepuram Govt. Hospital, and after 5 days, the baby faced difficulty in breathing and feeding. So she was referred to the Institute of Child Health (Egmore). There, the child was diagnosed with large sub-arterial VSD restricted by RCC causing mild AR, Moderate VSD shunt left to right, VSD gradient 40 mm Hg for which they advised to continue medication for a certain period of time. In the month of October, one of our staff nurses from Kancheepuram District Early Intervention Centre came to know about the health condition of the child.

She referred this child to our District Coordinator Mr. Rudhrakotti and the medical reports were forwarded to Dr. Harapriya – consultant Paediatric Cardiologist from MIOT hospital to get medical opinion.

Deva Varshini was later evaluated and recommended a very complicated but much needed procedure to repair the valves of her heart. The cost for the procedure could not be afforded by the family (whose total income per day was less than 100 Rs). The concerned parents did not know what to do and explained their plight to the consultant doctor who approached Ekam and asked her to support part-costs of the treatment so that the child could undergo the emergency procedure without further delay. Ekam immediately arranged for the procedure to be conducted and raised money through our contacts. On the 8th of December 2017, the child was admitted for the surgery.

The procedure was a huge success and Deva Varshini was discharged without any complications. Her parent's joys knew no bounds when they saw the smiling child, free of pain and illness.



Chhattisgarh - A gift after 20 years - nurtured out of danger in a Bilaspur SNCU

Lata from Bilaspur district, aged 20 years, gave birth to baby girl after a year of marriage. She had an institutional delivery at a Community Health Centre. The baby was categorized under ELBW (Extremely Low Birth Weight); she weighed 1.32 gm. Baby was born with symptoms of asphyxia, so she was referred to SNCU. District Hospital. Bilaspur. She was

admitted on 28/8/2017 in SNCU. In the unit, doctors and nurses paid special attention to the baby 24*7 and after 28 days of continuous efforts, the baby's weight increased by 2.00 Kg. Finally, she was discharged on 25/9/2017. All the post-discharge instructions were given to the mother, so that the growth and health of the baby could be tracked and maintained via follow-up process. We feel happy along with the mother since the baby is doing well in her follow-up process.



KARNATAKA- Provision of equipment to government hospitals

Provision of equipment to Government Hospitals is one of the vital ways through which Ekam reaches out to children. The program is a cost-effective approach to address infrastructure gaps in hospitals, while positively impacting many lives. We arrange the procurement of high priority, life-saving and diagnostic medical equipment that empowers healthcare workers with the tools they need to effectively save lives and provide reliable care. Kidwai Hospital in Bengaluru was one of the recipients of our equipment support program, which was instrumental in reaching out to over 100 babies per month.

TELANGANA - EKAM RESPONDS TO THIS CRY FOR HELP

Hospitals are difficult places at the best of times and more so for disadvantaged groups due to lack of awareness and sometimes owing to the presence of touts. Ekam Foundation has set up a "Help Desk" at the Govt., Maternity Hospital, Sultan Bazaar, and Koti in August 2017 to look after the special needs of disadvantaged groups and provides individual attention and personalized services. The team also empowers the public with information and guidance for exercising their rights & duties.

In Telangana, our Help-Desk team is available from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM at the facility. The first half of the day, the team is in the OP block and the second half of the day, the team goes to IP wards to provide counselling to patients. This year alone, we have solved 39,382 Patient queries in outpatient block and counselled 6,388 at in patient block. Altogether we have reached 45,770 people in the Hospital.





Tamilnadu - Awareness campaigns save lives

Selvi [name changed] from a village in Tiruvallur District was in labour. The nearest medical facility was 14 km away from her house and the roads were not great. Any attempt to use local transport to reach her to the facility would have been disastrous – there was no time to lose.

Suddenly, a voice from the crowd – in Tamil – roughly translated – "What about that Ekam sister? They said we can call the ambulance for emergency? Who has the number?" There was quick sharing of information and the help arrived in ten minutes, thanks to the Government's 108 ambulance facility.

We often wonder whether workshops, training and awareness camps are of use to the community. Here was the proof. Our awareness camps, training, our helpdesks, our referrals, ALL come together at the right time, in the right manner.

Donor management

We release regular reports and newsletters to all our donors and associates in order to update them about the status of our activities and initiatives. All reports to donors are accompanied with thank you letters and the mandatory tax exemption certificates. We try not to miss the connect with our Ekam Family by constantly engaging with them and sharing regular updates through our social media pages.



The way forward

A few of us can bring small changes. Some of us can bring impact. Many of us can create magic!! Nothing works better than the community that joins hands for a cause. The concept of oneness is engrained within the Ekam system, our approaches and our interventions. So is the idea of Self-Obsolescence. We know, understand and respect that we cannot do this alone. In other words, we wish to create a self-sustaining wheel of change, which will generate many more thinkers and doers (young and old) who will take charge and inspire action. Our programs for the year ahead focus on creating change agents and innovators on the field.
