SWBI / Ensure Early Identification

Medical camps are organised from time to time at various places for screening and identification of the community individuals who need medical intervention for any disease/ailment. A fully dedicated medical intervention is imparted ranging from hospitalisation support to provision of medicine etc

SWBI / Improving Community Awareness

Medical Awareness programs were conducted to Antenatal, Postnatal mothers, ICDS center workers, Self Help Group members, volunteers, school students, and the community. The topics covered during these programs were Maternal Health and Child Care, MNCH-Government Schemes, Importance of Dietary Diversity during ANC & PNC Periods, and MNCH Safety measures during COVID 19 pandemic

SWBI / Capacity Building - Kitchen Gardens

One of the key focus areas is to set up kitchen gardens at educational institutions, ICDS centres, primary health centres, and all the government facilities utilizing the bare lands in the vicinity where the growing produce will be contributed towards community consumption itself. It's an opportunity for community individuals to understand the essence of food and nutrition too.

SWBI/Adolescent Training

Adolescents are young people in the age group of 10-19 years. One youth volunteer per village will act as the local health volunteer and activist. Considering the huge demographic dividend in working with adolescents, we are trying to provide an enabling environment so that the adolescents are able to realize their full potential by staying informed and stand responsible towards decisions related to their health and well-being



174 Adolescent training sessions were conducted for school /college students and the community across Tamil Nadu by educating them about the importance of Anaemia, Menstrual and Personal Hygiene and Self-Awareness during the adolescent period.

SWBI / Livelihood Training

A sustainable livelihood is a sure must for the health and happiness quotient. EKAM Foundation has successfully intervened into situations where revival of livelihood opportunities or upgradation of working skills were needed on urgent basis.

SWBI/Cleaning Activities

Waste management is a vital requisite. To rehabilitate the safety and well-being of the environment, EKAM Foundation proposes to set up proper and systematic garbage collection and segregation procedures. It can also practise recycling or designate waste collection teams that would dispose of unusable garbage. EKAM is in line with the Village Health Sanitation and Nutrition Committee (VHSNC) is one of the major initiatives under the National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) that conducted Solid Waste management and Improvement of Sanitation in Villages.

We conducted 11 activities which include cleaning of the villages



SWBI/Change Management/ Governance Reforms/ Social Audit Committee

The main goal of Grama Sabha is to facilitate the convergence of rural development programs of the state and central governments at the selected villages through village development plan (VDP) and other processes associated with panchayat governance. The meetings are conducted by the Panchayat Heads to address the problems in the community, listen to public opinion regarding the problem and involve them in the decision making process. It intends to increase the community ownership among the people thus ensuring development and sustainability.



To help promote the skills of leadership, delegation and inclusion, 28 Grama Sabhas, 3 Change Management Workshops were organised and 36 District Level Committee and 147 Block Level Committee were formed !

Our battery of experts are continuously on a progressive interface to interact and impart the essence of various needed essentials to the beneficiaries. 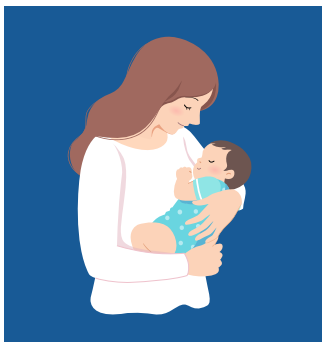

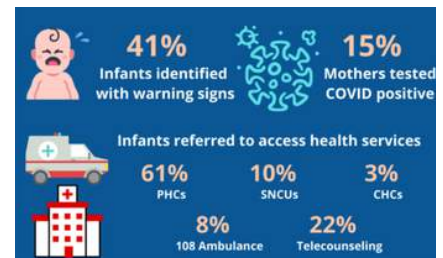

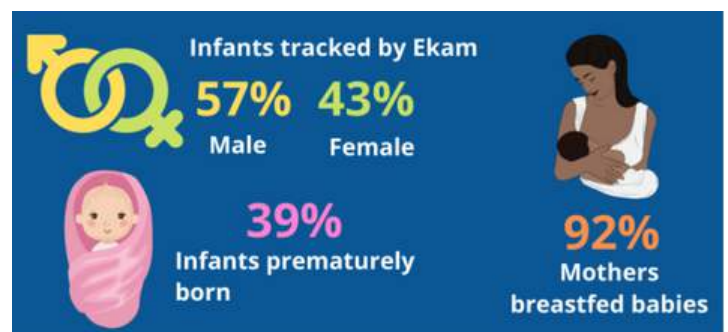

An initiative undertaken by the Department of Public Health Camp: Preventive Medicine (DPH Camp) supported by UNICEF and implemented by EKAM Foundation. This system aspires to track delivery of maternal and child health services both at facility and community level on a real time basis. Establish a robust referral mechanism between beneficiaries and health system delivery. THAIMAI aspires to enable access to real time information which in turn, will create an enabling platform for evidence-based decision making. A combination of mobile and web-based technology shall be used to fulfill these aspirations.

- Capturing information related services delivered to mothers and infants during antenatal, intra natal and the post-natal phase.
- Providing case-based information to VHNs on a real time basis for monitoring and observation.
- Real Time tracking of mother's availability and assisting mother in identification and locating nearby health facility.
- Optimise referral mechanism between beneficiary and health facility.
- Provide consolidated real time information to block, district and state level officials.
- Increasing community awareness through reminders, IEC materials and customised chatbots.

HELPDESK PROJECT - SUPPORT OUTSIDE THE LABOUR ROOM

Supported by

Help desks are established near the labour rooms to provide support to pregnant women who come for labour and delivery services. They provide round the clock services. Supported by National Health Mission - Hyderabad, the project covered 3 important major hospitals - Koti Hospital, Niloufer Hospitals, MHMG Petlaburi Hospital where patients and their relatives are facilitated in getting due service and entitlements to provide escort/attendant support to minor patients, patients admitted without family support, to create awareness amongst patients about their rights and responsibilities during their stay at the hospital, to conduct exit interviews randomly with 30 patients from OPD and IPD per month to assess patient satisfaction, to strengthen the referral system by ensuring coordination between the facilities referring and receiving referrals, to manage IEC/ Demonstration corners at Hospitals under the supervision of hospitals under the supervision of Hospital Authorities to coordinate with 102, 108 services for smooth admission at the appropriate wing, to facilitate patients and their attendants to avail of all services/ entitlements provided under different Govt Schemes such as RBSK, JSY JSSK etc To reduce the long waiting time for consultation and treatment.



Ekam Foundation operates the Help Desk on 24*7 modes in roster basis with the proposed HR:

- 1 Help Desk Supervisor across the 3 hospitals
- 4 Help Desk Assistants each at MGMH and GMH
- 6 Help Desk Assistants at Niloufer Hospital

The Help Desk Assistants report to help Desk Supervisor on a daily basis. The Help Desk Supervisor reports to the Ekam Head Office team on a daily/ Weekly basis.

DISASTER RISK REDUCTION

COVID-19 MANAGEMENT AND PREPAREDNESS (Community Response and Resilience)

Supported by



The aftermath of COVID pandemic rippled various scopes for other intervention strategies where it was important to strengthen the human resource involved and affected. It was a pleasant notion to witness interventions coming in from various expertise to infuse a sense of strength and relief into the panic stricken community members. We took ourselves on an interactive interface with rural administrative structures to bring in an assuring rise for the future. Also some calming pleasant moments kindled the entire vibe with various benefitting activities.

Strengthening the capacity of 1000 persons (Members Of Local Self-Government, CBOs & Volunteers) from 200 GPs, including the EKAM Team to pandemic & hazard events.

- 186 Gram Panchayats have been connected through a virtual dialogue platform through which collective sharing and learning process has been going on.
- 186 Gram Panchayats have been facilitated to manage Covid 19 (Volunteers are supporting in organising C19 vaccination camps).
- Gram Panchayats situated in coastal areas were facilitated for effective shelter management (Privacy for lactating mothers, safety for pregnant women, infants C19 preventive measures).
- Flood relief interventions implemented through 7 panchayats in Cuddalore, Thiruvarur and Nagapattiam Districts.

Strengthening the capacity of 1000 persons (Members of Local Self - Government, CBO & Volunteers) from 200 GPs, Including the Ekam Team to pandemic & hazard events.

- 210 Children (who have been orphaned/ semi-orphaned by Covid 19) were reached with Tele - Counseling support (in partnership with the concerned District Child Protection Offices).
- Grief counselling sessions were facilitated (virtual) for 16 bereaved families.
- 12 Children were facilitated to celebrate birthday (virtual) (During Sundays Lockdown, Third Wave).
- Free Online drawing classes, music classes and craft class psychosocial support intervention (88 sessions so far reaching about 800 children).
- Organised Competitions (Drawing, Elocution, Essay Writing) connecting with C19 prevention. 913 Children participated in it. Children's inputs were consolidated and shared with TNDRA (pertaining to School Safety).
- Covid 19 and Disaster management literacy through Communicative. English Classes (Virtual) 28 sessions so far reaching 96 children.
- Group Counselling: 197 children have attended group counselling sessions so far (C19 vaccination for parents, Dealing with Electronic gadgets, Peer group learning, dealing with examinations.)
- Peer Group Learning Sessions: Child Achievers are being identified and facilitated to have dialogue with children (Virtual). Two such motivational sessions have been organised so far reaching 247 children.
- Psychosocial support for children from marginalised factors: 4 sessions have been conducted so far (offline) covering about 30 children in Chennai.

- 42 Shelters were supported through volunteers in terms of ensuring shelter management (Covid 19)
- SOPs, Privacy for Lactating Mothers, Safety for Pregnant Women, Children, Drinking water, sanitation etc) (Including shelters reached through Multipurpose Social Service Societies in Chennai, Chengalpattu Districts)
- 723 Children were reached with nutritional food packets (most affected villages in Thiruvarur and Nagapattinam Districts) Thanks to CIT82 Charity, Coimbatore)
- 452 families were reached with Tarpaulins (to cover damaged roofs) (Thanks to CIT82 Charity, Coimbatore).
- 2000 Adolescent girls were reached with 'Sanitary Napkin Kit' (Thanks to CIT82 Charity, Coimbatore).
- 2600 families were facilitated to have access to food (Thanks to Multipurpose Social Service Societies of Chennai, Cuddalore, Thoothukudi and Chengalpattu, Voluntary Groups).

COVID 19 Pandemic adversely impacted the lives of people living in clusters of hamlets in Jawadhu Hills, Tiruvannamalai District. The overall objective was to work towards supporting the people of Jawadhu hills to deal with the Covid 19 Pandemic. The main set objectives were reaching the Unreached Clusters of Hamlets with Medical Services (especially women, pregnant women and children), enabling the Children to gain better health status through providing them nutritional foodstuff and then supporting men involved in collecting wild honey who needed 'First Aid Medical Kit'.

STRENGTHENING MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH IN 4 PANCHAYATS OF KANCHEEPURAM AND CHENGALPATTU DISTRICTS OF TAMIL NADU

Supported by



The project was initiated with an aim to reduce the child and maternal deaths and bring about a sustainable development by improving the overall well-being of the mothers and children in the four panchayats namely Chennai Kuppam, Nattarasampattu, Vallam, and Valayakaranai of Kanchipuram and Chengalpattu district. Also, it aimed at creating Model Labour rooms in the Primary Health Care Centres as per Government's LaQshya (Labour Room Quality Improvement Initiative) guidelines, which would facilitate an improvement in the intrapartum and immediate post-partum care and thereby contribute to Ekam's vision of Respectful Maternity Care.

The project aimed at providing livelihood skills training to 528 women among 44 Self-Help Groups (SHG) in Virudhunagar district of Tamil Nadu. The project intended to provide essential skills for sustainable income, health education, and train women in Entrepreneurship by establishing small-scale businesses and making the women as health mentors. Additionally, the beneficiaries will be motivated towards saving money for meeting health requirements of the community, bringing a sense of togetherness and responsibility.

Teach For Good Program - Desktop support to schools Strengthening education protocol with logistical inductions

The modern day education system stands on a mandate of imparting knowledge through advanced technical strategies and computer aided learning plays a pivotal role in it. The education infrastructure in rural areas is compromised at places and lacks provision of computer aided learning due to non availability of related logistics. In this project, we identified the need of such missing resources and intervened to fill such gaps by providing computer machines to the rural schools in Tamil Nadu – India. Just because of PayPal, 12 schools in rural areas of Tamil Nadu are now equipped with computer machines!! Ekam supported UNICEF in carrying out an Independent Supportive Supervision of all the Cold Chain Points and Cold Chain Equipment for minimising 'Cold Chain Sickness Rate' in the Tamil Nadu State. The exercise evaluated readiness of the Cold Chain Points and Cold Chain Equipment for storage and distribution of vaccines from vaccine stores to last mile cold chain points and further to the session sites, upon receipt from Government of India and thus minimising the Cold Chain Sickness Rate. An external agency implemented the supportive supervision of 2700 Cold Chain Points at the field level and also ensured data quality and documentation. Ekam District Coordinators visited at field level to around 410 Cold Chain Points and monitored the assessment.

Zohara being a widow lives with her two kids in Karamadai. She does all the jobs that come her way to support her two children. She is the only sole breadwinner of the family. Though she goes for work her salary wasn't sufficient to fulfil her family's needs.

During the COVID- 19 pandemic she faced severe health issues and economic loss. Which imposed double triple marginalisation on her end. Even after the lockdown her health condition was bad and so she couldn't find any job.

After doing a complete livelihood assessment, we found out that she had good cooking skills. On suggestion, Ekam intervened and set up a food stall for Ms. Zohara. The team supported her start up by providing all the necessary materials to her. Gradually her business picked up. The intervention helped her to attain financial stability out of all odds.

Raja Sir Ramaswamy Mudaliar (RSRM) Lying-in Hospital which is the Obstetrics and Gynecology Department of Government Stanley Medical College in Chennai, Tamil Nadu and its catchment area/community comprises six zones catering to 11,20,760 population. The pandemic and lockdown restrictions have exacerbated existing socioeconomic disparities, making women from marginalised communities even more vulnerable in these exceptional conditions. The health-seeking behaviour of pregnant women and new moms has been significantly influenced by the lockdown measures, which include social distancing norms and travel limits, financial restraints, and fear of getting the virus at hospitals. In this context, we aimed to improve Maternal and Child Health Services in the RSRM hospital and adjacent areas for COVID positive and Post COVID mothers and children.

Mareeshwari, is a married woman living with 5 members in the family. In Pre-covid times, she used to prepare Idli Dosa batter manually earning Rs. 2000 per month. With the Covid pandemic situation in the country, her family income has been meagre. Knowing her requirement and to support her family economically, Mareeshwari has now been supported with a Grinder machine worth Rs. 7700. It is an electronic machine for easy Idli Dosa Batter preparation. The machine holds 3 litres capacity and hence, the batter can now be prepared and sold in no-time. She now prepares and sells the batter and is earning around Rs. 4,000 per month. She feels happy to have been able to run her own independent business successfully. EKAM Foundation stands on an established reputation to strategise and innovate upon the headers which lead to maternal and child health. From expertise ranging from knowledge transfers, medical aid assistance, resource provisions, mentoring and guidance etc, EKAM Foundation also aspires for provision of nutrition kit supplies to ensure fulfilment of required health regimes specially for the pregnant women. Realising the compassion quotient involved, EKAM Foundation recently partnered with Give India to design an efficient executional structure to donate nutrition kits to pregnant women across 38 districts of Tamil Nadu [INDIA]. The entire campaign was no less than an excellent knowledge transfer protocol in itself where the beneficiaries were initially identified and then subsequently educated and trained on the importance of nutrition quotients specially related to their own health regimes. They were equipped with adequate education materials too which very well covered topics such as promoting adequate weight gain through sufficient and balanced protein and energy intake, education on using locally available low-cost material for preparing nutritious recipes, preventing micronutrient deficiencies and anaemia and importance of micronutrient supplements, food supplements or fortified foods. Also there were provisions on topics which spoke about accessing generalised household ration through the Public Distribution System, a food subsidy scheme and supplementary rations (from ICDS). Once they are made aware of the importance of consuming a healthy diet and also supported to initiate it, the likelihood of them continuing the healthy diet further also increases. We would like to convey a heartiest thanks to Give India, who extended their much needed support on time for this important initiative. It is because of Give India only that many pregnant women in Tamil Nadu are now on a healthy diet and additionally they are also the knowledge bearers on the same now.



In total, 1520 pregnant women [40 pregnant women from each of the 38 districts of Tamil Nadu] benefited from this initiative as nutrition kits were given to each of these beneficiaries continuously for 3 months in a row
