



HEALTHCARE IN MATERNAL AND NEWBORN WELL-BEING

Medical equipment is a keystone in newborn and maternal care, playing a pivotal role in ensuring the well-being of both infants and mothers. They contribute not only to early detection of complications but also facilitate emergency responses, ensuring a comprehensive and compassionate healthcare approach for expectant mothers and newborns.

ONGC'S VITAL SUPPORT TO GOVERNMENT HEALTH FACILITIES IN VIRUDHUNAGAR AND RAMANATHAPURAM DISTRICTS

ELEVATING HEALTHCARE ACCESS THROUGH CRITICAL MEDICAL EQUIPMENT SUPPORT

Uniphore is dedicated to providing critical medical equipment to the Institute of Obstetrics and Gynaecology (IOG) and Urban Primary Health Centers (UPHC) in **Kodambakkam Zone, Greater Chennai Corporation**. The objective is to enhance healthcare facilities for the Project Beneficiaries. To maintain transparency, financial utilization certificates and annual project impact reports will be provided over a three-year period, fostering a collaborative commitment to healthcare excellence.









Their commitment to innovation has been able to navigate challenges and find sustainable solutions to address issues in our focus areas.

EQUIPMENT SUPPORT AT THE INSTITUTE OF OBSTETRICS AND GYNECOLOGY

The IOG and Government Hospital for Women and Children in **Egmore**, **Chennai**, serve as the largest Maternal and Child Health Hospital, managing a high number of referral cases for sick babies. With a commitment to providing medical care to marginalized communities, especially those unable to afford private healthcare, the Pediatric ICUs at this government hospital handle a significant caseload from both immediate and surrounding regions. For extremely premature infants facing respiratory challenges, the adoption of High-Frequency Oscillatory Ventilation (HFOV) emerges as a crucial, baby-friendly alternative, improving lung function and enhancing the survival rates of preterm and extremely low birth weight newborns.

VITAL EQUIPMENT SUPPORT FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PEDIATRIC HEMATOLOGY/ONCOLOGY, INSTITUTE OF CHILD HEALTH AND HOSPITAL FOR CHILDREN

At ICH & HC, Egmore, Chennai, the largest stand-alone Children's Hospital in Asia and the Apex Public Sector Pediatric Hospital of Madras Medical College, established in 1968, free services are provided to patients from newborns to adolescence across 16 Pediatric Super Specialties, including Pediatric Hematology/Oncology, Gastroenterology, Neurology, Nephrology, Cardiology, Pulmonology, Neonatology, and Surgery.

The Pediatric Hematology department at ICH & HC, established in 1987, serves as a tertiary referral center for children from Tamil Nadu and neighboring states like Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, and Kerala. Despite catering to diverse socioeconomic classes and receiving referrals from private hospitals, it faces increasing patient influx, especially with the recent surge due to the COVID-19 pandemic-induced economic crisis. To maintain quality care amid rising demands, additional equipment is urgently needed to address the growing patient load and ensure optimal 1:1 care for sick children, ultimately improving treatment outcomes.

EQUIPMENT SUPPORT AT (RSRM) LYING-IN RAJA SIR RAMASWAMY MUDALIAR HOSPITAL STANLEY & NAGAPATTINAM SNCU

Raja Sir Ramaswamy Mudaliar (RSRM) Lying-in Hospital, the Obstetrics and Gynecology Department of Government Stanley Medical College in **Tamil Nadu**, stands as a pillar of maternal and child healthcare. Serving a diverse population across six zones, it annually witnesses approximately 12,000 deliveries, with a commendable 4,800 babies discharged in excellent health. Notably, 50% of deliveries at RSRM are categorized as high-risk, attracting referrals from North Chennai and neighboring districts, including Andhra Pradesh. This hospital addresses the unique needs of its community, especially in dealing with the challenges posed by 35% of births involving low birth and extremely low birth weight babies. The dedicated medical intervention and extended hospital stay provided contribute significantly to the recovery of these vulnerable infants.



Within the heart of **Nagapattinam** lies the Government Hospital, witnessing an average of 300-350 deliveries each month. Among them, 100-150 infants find care in the Special Newborn Care Unit (SNCU). Notably, the Nagapattinam Government Hospital SNCU extends its reach beyond its own deliveries, serving as the sole referral center for newborns from other hospitals in the region. In this land of uncertainty, the Nagapattinam Government Hospital SNCU stands as a beacon, providing crucial and intensive care to newborns, fostering hope and health in the community.





This support not only elevates the quality of medical education but also plays a crucial role in advancing pediatric emergency care, ultimately contributing to better health outcomes for children in the region.

PROVISION OF NON-MEDICAL EQUIPMENT TO THE PREM-NHM SIMULATION LABORATORY AT REGIONAL COLLABORATIVE CENTER- INSTITUTE OF CHILD HEALTH (ICH), CHENNAI

Annually, the Ambulance service transports **1000-1200** children, with over 500 facing trauma, poisoning, submersion, burns, and more. In response, the Government of India advocates for capacity building in pediatric emergency care. Laerdal's CSR initiative, spanning from October 2021 to March 2023, focuses on the PREM Skill Laboratory. Targeting frontline doctors, nurses, and medical students, this project aims to save children's lives in critical situations, aligning with **WHO SDG goals** to halve U5M through professional training on the Golden Hour in pediatric emergencies.

Additionally, we aimed to boost the well-being of the community by upgrading the ICDS center with necessary non-medical logistics. With strategic interventions at three key medical resource points in Kancheepuram district, including **GH Uthiramerur**, **ICDS Uthiramerur CDPO**, and **Kancheepuram SNCU**, patients now experience improved ease and enhanced medical treatment, contributing to an overall uplift in health and happiness.

COMMUNITY MOBILIZATION

At Ekam, we believe in empowering mothers and communities to become local champions of knowledge. Through various awareness programs on Maternal, Child, and Adolescent Care, we aim to foster self-reliance and wellbeing. From September 2022 to March 2023, our dedicated community trainers conducted 8 enlightening sessions for antenatal mothers. Covering topics such as Safe Motherhood, Prenatal Development, Labour and Delivery, and Nutritional Diversity, these programs directly impacted **161 mothers**, nurturing a stronger, healthier community.





Additionally, we conducted 6 Adolescent training programs, engaging **123 youths**. These sessions focused on critical topics such as anaemia management, addressing gender-based violence, understanding rights and entitlements, and navigating issues related to sex and growth.

ENSURING CONTINUITY OF CARE



Our diligent tracking program allowed our part-time workers to personally engage with **39 antenatal mothers**, **45 postnatal mothers**, **and 50 children**. Through one-on-one counseling sessions, these families received crucial guidance on maternal and child health, fostering a deeper understanding and support system.



INFRASTRUCTURE UPGRADATION FOR CREATING MODEL LABOUR ROOMS AND THEREBY ENSURING RESPECTFUL MATERNITY CARE

Respectful maternity care is crucial for positive outcomes for mothers and newborns, as well as long-term cognitive development. To achieve this, model labor rooms were planned for 2 PHCs after detailed assessments of 4 PHCs. Construction began in September 2022, with Padappai PHC completed in March. Interior work is also finished. Construction continues for Panrutti PHC, and labor ward upgrade for Vallam PHC is underway pending final permissions.









THAIMAI PROJECT

THE REAL-TIME TRACKING OF MOTHER AND CHILDREN PROJECT




The project, operating in the of Ellapuram block Thiruvallur district and Kolli Hills block of Namakkal district. Tamil Nadu. aimed to capture maternal and child health outcomes through Thaimai modules. Focused on antenatal. intranatal, and postnatal phases, the included real-time data project capture, case-based information for VHNs, tracking mother's availability, optimizing referral mechanisms, and providing consolidated information to officials. To ensure success, training programs were conducted at state, district, and block levels, imparting knowledge to government officials. health workers. and community members. Training materials, including presentations, modules. translations. FAQs, banners, and standees. were reviewed, finalized, and developed to enhance program effectiveness.







KOLLI HILLS BLOCK




In Kolli Hills, Namakkal, the Thaimai module pilot, supported by **16** Village Health Nurses (VHNs) and **37** Accredited Social Health Activists (ASHAs), engaged **248** antenatal (AN) and **392** postnatal (PN) mothers between September 20th and October 30th, 2022.

Despite challenges, VHNs and ASHAs assisted these mothers in installing and logging into the Thaimai mother's module on their mobile phones. While 359 PN mothers with children under 6 months had access, only 132 logged in, citing limited timelines and challenges in follow-up due to immunization visits and geographic constraints in the hilly terrains of Kolli Hills.

ELLAPURAM BLOCK:

In the Ellapuram block, encompassing five Primary Health Centers and **26** Health Sub Centers, the Thaimai app pilot initiative, conducted between June 15th and August 3rd, 2022, engaged **25** Village Health Nurses (VHNs), 21 Middle Level Health Providers (MLHPs), and **26** Women Health Volunteers (WHVs).




Supporting a total of 1011 antenatal (AN) and 2825 postnatal (PN) mothers, 828 AN and 1554 PN mothers received hands-on assistance from VHNs, MLHPs, and WHVs to install and log into the Thaimai mother's module on their mobile phones. A comparison with the implementation and technical team report validated the login details in the Thaimai server database. Leveraging 26 volunteers for door-to-door assistance and phone support, coupled with ICDS workers' efforts and distribution of vernacular flyers, aimed to extend the reach of the Thaimai module initiative to more mothers in the Ellapuram block.

PILOT TESTING OF DECK CARDS FOR FIRST 1000 DAYS AT PERIYAPALAYAM



In the current project, a set of deck cards, serving as a Social Behaviour Change Communication Tool (SBCC), was developed to enhance maternal and child well-being. Tested at Palayangara ICDS center and the UPHC of Periyapalayam, these cards cover essential messages on physical, emotional, and mental aspects of pregnancy, birth, and postpartum care. The deck, focused on the first 1000 days, incorporates small phrases for dialogue initiation and includes QR codes with voice notes for further explanation, making it applicable to real-life situations

Led by community trainers and lactation specialists, the exercise involved key personnel from Ekam and UNICEF, engaging in an interactive session with antenatal and postnatal mothers.

An initial icebreaker game was followed by pre-test forms to gauge knowledge levels. Trainers presented card content, distributed the deck for understanding, and noted mothers' feedback. A post-test was conducted, despite challenges with a moving crowd.



Discussions occurred at PHCs with mothers and key stakeholders, including Anganwadi workers, SHNs, VHNs, Birth Educators, and community coordinators. This inclusive session aimed at gathering insights and feedback for tool refinement. From the information provided, a deck of cards with voice notes was developed and designed to raise awareness among mothers and their families about essential factors promoting maternal and child health and well-being.





UNICEF DISASTER RISK REDUCTION PROJECT

Summary of Achievements



- Supported 42 shelters with volunteers managing shelter operations, ensuring Covid-19 SOPs, privacy for lactating mothers, safety for pregnant women and children, and sanitation (including shelters reached through Multipurpose Social Service Societies in Chennai, Chengalpattu Districts).
- Organized C19 vaccination camps with Local Self Governing Bodies, mobilizing about 10,000 people in 191 Panchayats.
- Engaged 773 volunteers virtually in Covid-19 disease control.
- Provided Psychosocial Support Interventions to 1,426 children through virtual group counselling sessions and other programs.
- Volunteers became part of GO-NGO Coordination committees in various districts.
- Identified core team of volunteers with the potential to be trained as 'Master Trainers' to train others.
- Strengthened multi-stakeholder (collaborative) approach by establishing good rapport with District Children Protection Offices.
- Established working relationships with 73 NGOs and 72 CBOs, collaborating closely with TNDRRA, Greater Chennai Corporation, State Labour Welfare Office, State Child Protection Office, and District Child Protection Offices.
- Conducted Disaster Risk Reduction activities during the monsoon season, reaching 10,000 people through 'Shelter Management Interventions' in Chengalpattu, Tiruvallur, and Kancheepuram Districts.

Strengthening the Capacity of 1000 Persons

Engaged 773 volunteers virtually for C19 disease control. Virtual engagement of 76 CBOs. Facilitated 191 Gram Panchayats in organizing C19 vaccination camps.

Psychosocial Counselling Intervention

Reached 456 families through Kids Art and Music Workshops, and group counselling sessions. Conducted 34 sessions on Communicative English Classes virtually for children. Provided teleconsulting follow-up services to 61 families affected by C19.

Strengthening Virtual Facilitation Center

Virtually engaged all 33 districts, contributing to C19 disease control. Identified core team of volunteers for '**Master Trainers**.' Collaborated closely with District administrations and NGOs for disaster relief during floods.





Preparedness for Disaster Risk Reduction:

Strengthened grassroots forces for efficient and effective Disaster Risk Reduction.

Conducted pre-monsoon preparedness activities, reaching about 10,000 people through shelter management interventions.

B/o. Sangeetha, a 4-month-old baby from Chengalpet district, was diagnosed with sepsis/Skeletal suspected Dysplasia and suspected primary immunodeficiency. She received under NICU treatment Care. including antibiotics and Intravenous Immunoglobulin therapy. With her father's monthly income of Rs. 10,000 as a fish monger, they couldn't afford the medical Recognizing their financial expenses. Ekam supported Rs. constraints. 51.530 towards the child's medication costs. She was 06.12.2021 discharged on and continues regular follow-up care.



Mr. Kanagaraj, a casual laborer in Coimbatore District, earns Rs. 12,000 monthly. His 1-yearold son, Sathvik, was diagnosed with Right The Hydronephrosis. surgery cost was estimated at Rs. 70,000. With only Rs. 35,000 they struggled to cover arranged, the remaining amount. Recognizing their hardship, we supported Rs. 35,000 for the Sathvik treatment. was discharged on 04/10/2022 and is now leading a healthy life.





Ms. Vijayamma, from Kadapa District, Andhra Pradesh, welcomed twin boys prematurely on May 28, 2021, at Chennai Fertility Centre. With various complications including respiratory distress and sepsis, the twins required extensive care at Rainbow Children's Hospital in Guindy. Despite the father's monthly income of Rs. 8,000 as a farmer, and spending Rs. 7,50,000 on NICU expenses, they still needed financial assistance. Recognizing their plight, Ekam provided Rs. 50,000 towards the NICU stay, ensuring the successful treatment of the infants. Discharged on July 15, 2022, the twins now enjoy a healthy start to life.

NAGALAND'S KIPHIRE: EMPOWERING STUDENTS THROUGH THE NURSING EDUCATION PROJECT

In Kiphire, significant disparities exist across districts in various health indicators, primarily stemming from a shortage of trained healthcare personnel, especially in healthcare Poor infrastructure remote areas. exacerbates this issue, with a lack of quality nursing colleges further hindering skill development. Recognizing the pivotal role of education in enhancing healthcare services, EKAM has been approached to address this challenge by bolstering maternal and child healthcare in Kiphire District through capacity building and quality nursing education.



As of March 2023, 5 students have successfully completed their GNM course, while four are set to finish their B.Sc Nursing program by February 2024."

The project, conducted in collaboration between the District Commissioner's Office and Ekam Foundation, aims to address these gaps by providing education and training to deserving students. Supported by funding from REC, the initiative targets nine students—four pursuing B.Sc Nursing and five completing General Nursing Midwifery (GNM) courses at reputable private nursing colleges in India.

Key Objectives:

1.Enhance healthcare facilities at CMCH by addressing infrastructure gaps.2.Ensure health equity for marginalized communities.

Despite challenges such as the ongoing pandemic and logistical constraints, our teams have made significant progress. Projects include renovating adult fever wards into specialized units like IMCUs, upgrading surgical intensive care units, and improving pediatric wards. These efforts have resulted in improved service delivery, increased bed capacity, and enhanced patient care.

While challenges persist, our commitment to building resilient healthcare infrastructure remains unwavering. Together, we strive to create a healthcare system that leaves no one behind, ensuring access to quality care for all.

Beneficiary Impact:



- Over 100 COVID patients treated in the Fever Ward with advanced care.
- Post-pandemic, 30 to 50 patients treated monthly in the Fever Ward.
- Over 700 cases treated in the Toxicology Ward in the past year.
- SICU capacity increased from 8 to 19 beds, resulting in increased surgeries and reduced mortalities.
- Pediatric Ward expanded by 20 beds, accommodating more cases during fever seasons, benefiting an average of 200 cases monthly.
- Life-saving equipment like Video EEG and X-ray aid in diagnosing and treating 50 to 70 pediatric emergency cases monthly, saving many lives in the Pediatric ICU at CMCH

The COVID-19 pandemic has worsened rural inequalities, pushing many into poverty and hunger due to lockdowns impacting livelihoods. The economic crisis has deepened in cities, leaving many jobless and struggling. Vulnerable communities are especially affected, with families losing breadwinners and facing higher prices for essentials, leading to significant socio-economic changes.

According to CMIE, the unemployment rate spiked from **8%** in **April 2021** to **13.6%** by **June 2021**, highlighting the urgent need to focus on livelihoods. In response, RBEI/CSR and Ekam Foundation are partnering to rebuild sustainable livelihoods for **100** at-risk families in Coimbatore Bosch Neighborhoods. This initiative aims to address the devastating impact of the pandemic on livelihoods and communities.

Achievements include supporting 100 families with sustainable livelihoods, despite challenges posed by the pandemic. BUILDING SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOODS FOR COVID-19 IMPACTED FAMILIES IN COIMBATORE


Amid the second wave of COVID-19, vulnerable communities, already struggling with poverty exacerbated by the first wave, faced heightened challenges such as loss of livelihoods and increased hunger. The situation was dire, with a 77 percent increase in the number of individuals below the poverty line in India from March to October 2020. The second wave worsened the crisis as primary breadwinners succumbed to the virus, leaving families grappling with higher prices of essential services and disruptions in health, hygiene, and education services. This adversely affected socio-economic conditions, health outcomes, and the well-being of individuals, necessitating urgent action to address basic needs such as food security, social support, and livelihood restoration.



Ekam's Sustainable Livelihood Vision

Ekam envisions economically empowering 100 Covid-19 impacted families in Coimbatore to achieve self-reliance by facilitating sustainable livelihoods. By equipping vulnerable community members with the infrastructure, skills, and market linkages necessary to establish microenterprises, Ekam aims to empower them economically and promote better health-seeking behavior within the community. Financially empowered individuals, particularly women, are better positioned to make investments in healthcare, sanitation, nutrition, and overall well-being, leading to improved household outcomes.





The project's aim is to empower 100 Covid-19 impacted families in Coimbatore by establishing sustainable livelihoods for selfreliance.

Operating from August 2021 to September 2022, it targets beneficiaries in Periya Nayakan Palayam, Sarkar Sama Kulam, Annur, and Karamadai. Through a strategic approach, vulnerable families are identified, strengths assessed, and tailored support provided, including skill training and market linkages.

Utilizing detailed assessments via Google Forms, the project evaluates Household and Livelihood Needs, Baseline, and Endline data to measure intervention effectiveness. delves Data analysis into demographics, income changes, savings, and access to government schemes,

unveiling positive impacts postintervention.





Furthermore, case studies like Ms. Virgin Rosalin and Ms. Dhanalakshmi exemplify how Ekam's support has transformed lives, underscoring the project's significance.



BUILDING SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOODS FOR COVID-19 IMPACTED FAMILIES IN BANGALORE

This significantly impacted socio-economic conditions, health outcomes, and overall well-being. The pressing need is to address basic necessities such as food, social security, livelihood restoration, and to raise awareness about testing and vaccinations. Ekam's sustainable livelihood vision aims to equip vulnerable community members in Bangalore with the infrastructure, skills, and market linkages necessary for establishing micro-enterprises, thereby fostering economic empowerment and promoting better health-seeking behavior. By financially empowering individuals, particularly women, the project seeks to improve household well-being. Operating from August 2021 to September 2022, the project targets beneficiaries in Koramangala, Madiwala, Adugodi, Wilson Garden, and Siddapura, providing tailored support based on vulnerability aspects such as income levels, loss of livelihood, and family demographics.







Through detailed assessments and interventions, the project aims to measure the effectiveness of livelihood interventions and their impact on key indicators such as income, savings, and access to government schemes. Case studies, like those of Ms. Virgin Rosalin and Ms. Dhanalakshmi, exemplify the transformative impact of Ekam's support on individual beneficiaries, underscoring the project's importance in empowering families to achieve self-reliance through sustainable livelihoods.

Deepa Shetty, a skilled tailor from Udupi, moved to Bangalore eight years ago after getting married. With her husband and two children, she faced financial hardship when her husband lost his job during the Covid pandemic. Ekam initiated impactful capacity-building programs for UPHC and RSRM nurses, focusing on enhancing their skills in Basic Gynaecological Physiotherapy and Lactation support. Through comprehensive training sessions, nurses gained expertise in providing better care to pregnant women in their community. Topics covered included effective communication, counselling, exclusive breastfeeding, and antenatal/postnatal physiotherapy exercises. These sessions, each lasting approximately 3 hours, equipped nurses with the knowledge and skills needed to support pregnant women and new mothers empathetically and effectively.

CAPACITY BUILDING FOR RSRM STAFFS



Ekam Foundation conducted capacity-building sessions in the Tondiarpet zone, reaching **3820** community members to enhance awareness on maternal and child care. These sessions covered a range of important topics including prenatal care, nutrition, childbirth preparation, breastfeeding, immunization, hygiene, and recognizing childhood illnesses. By empowering mothers with vital information and providing a platform for addressing their concerns, we aim to support informed decision-making for the health and well-being of both mothers and children.

AWARENESS SESSION AT COMMUNITY



Ekam Foundation empowers families by providing crucial information and guidance on maternal and child health care. Through raising awareness about prenatal care, nutrition, hygiene, and postnatal care, we empower communities to make informed decisions and take proactive steps to ensure the health and safety of their loved ones. These initiatives foster healthier families and contribute to the overall well-being of the community. Together, we're making a difference by equipping individuals with the knowledge and resources they need for a healthier future.



ESTABLISHING A POSITIVE ECOSYSTEM TO FACILITATE THE WELL-BEING OF 9600 MOTHERS AND CHILDREN

Ekam established a wellness studio at RSRM Hospital, focused on the well-being of high-risk antenatal and postnatal mothers. Services such as lactation counseling, high-risk counseling, NICU baby mother counseling, and gynecological physiotherapy are offered to facilitate access to quality healthcare services and promote overall well-being.

Gynecological Physiotherapy sessions were conducted for high-risk antenatal and postnatal mothers, focusing on various aerobic and strengthening exercises taught by a physiotherapist. These exercises help pregnant women adjust to increasing weight, reduce low back pain, and strengthen pelvic floor muscles. Post-natal exercises aid in restoring muscle strength, firming the body, promoting weight loss, and relieving stress. Together, we're empowering mothers to prioritize their health during this critical period.



LACTATION COUNSELLING-RSRM HOSPITAL



At RSRM hospital, postnatal mothers receive regular lactation counseling both in the IPD and OPD. These sessions emphasize the importance of exclusive breastfeeding and dispel myths surrounding complementary feeding. Mothers are educated daily on breastfeeding benefits, proper positioning and attachment, debunking myths, and the drawbacks of formula feeding. Lactation counseling provides vital guidance, support, and solutions to common breastfeeding challenges, especially beneficial for high-risk antenatal and postnatal mothers requiring specialized care



HIGH-RISK COUNSELLING-RSRM HOSPITAL



High-risk cases receive counseling on early danger sign identification, birth preparedness, maternal nutrition, and breastfeeding initiation. Conditions such as gestational diabetes, hypertension, hypothyroidism, anemia, and teenage pregnancy are addressed. This counseling is vital for identifying and managing potential complications, ensuring that high-risk mothers are well-informed and receive optimal care to minimize risks and improve health outcomes.

NICU COUNSELLING

Postnatal mothers, whose babies are admitted to the NICU, receive personalized counseling on Kangaroo Mother Care (KMC), postpartum mental health, and nutrition. NICU baby mother counseling offers emotional support, education, and guidance to mothers navigating the challenges of having a baby in intensive care. This counseling promotes bonding, encourages maternal involvement in baby care, and provides valuable emotional support. Our counselor helps mothers process feelings of guilt or inadequacy, offering empathy and reframing perspectives to focus on their positive role in their baby's development.





SUPPORT GROUP MEETING-RSRM HOSPITAL

BREASTFEEDING WEEK CELEBRATION HCL CAMPUS



We celebrated "**World Breastfeeding Week**" at HCL Chennai campus on August 4th. Over 180 employees engaged with models and posters, increasing awareness about breastfeeding. Men employees learned about their role in supporting breastfeeding. Interactive activities like a ring game and "Stick your views" were part of the event, encouraging active participation.



Marking "World Population Day" on July 11th, 2022, at RSRM Hospital, we conducted a group session for Antenatal mothers, sensitizing them to the global issue of Population Growth and emphasizing family planning and safe pregnancy. Then, on August 2nd, during "World Breastfeeding Week," we held a group awareness session for 35 Antenatal mothers, highlighting the importance of Exclusive Breastfeeding, dispelling myths, and promoting proper nutrition. 
